Sir,

At the outset I thank you for having spared your time to visit our Chamber to take the firsthand account of the problem faced by our members. In this regard, we would like to draw your kind attention to certain issues which require your immediate attention –

1) Disposal of Bio-Medical waste of Nursing homes in Jamshedpur.

This is a very serious problem which is being confronted by all the Nursing homes of Jamshedpur. In absence of any proper facilities for disposal of bio-medical waste, there is a probability that such waste is being disposed in a manner that could be leading to health hazard.

We propose that incinerator at MGM be suitably upgraded so that all Nursing homes can dispose bio-medical waste in that incinerator and till then TMH being instructed to accept bio-medical wastes from Nursing Homes.

2) Honourable High Court had been pleased to award judgment in several cases that the Thermal Power Plant have to deliver fly ash to fly ash brick manufacturers free of cost. However, this practice is not being followed.

We propose that a suitable guide line be issued from your office to all Thermal Power Plants to deliver Fly Ash to Fly Ash brick manufacturers free of any charges.

3) Environment and Forest Ministry Govt. of India vide notification no. SO 2804(E) New Delhi dated 3.11.2009 has notified that within an area of 100 Km. from the Power Plant, all types of construction should use Fly Ash bricks.

We request you to issue suitable guidelines to enforce the above notification.

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Inspite of repeated follow-up the notification no. 763(E) dated 14.09.1999, para II, Sub para-V of the environment and Forest Ministry, Govt. of India is not being follow. The above para's of the notification instructs that Thermal Power Plant/Centre/State shall provide land, electricity and water to fly ash products manufacturers. This is not being followed.

We propose that a suitable instruction be circulated for implementation.

We propose that all consents issued to industries should be for period of 5 years instead of the present practice of 1 year. This shall reduce the burden on the department as well as the industry.

Issue of NOC : time line should be decided for issue of NOC to applicants. Incase the NOC's are not issued within the said time line and no queries raised in the period, the NOC should be deemed to be granted. This shall go a long way in expediting projects.
